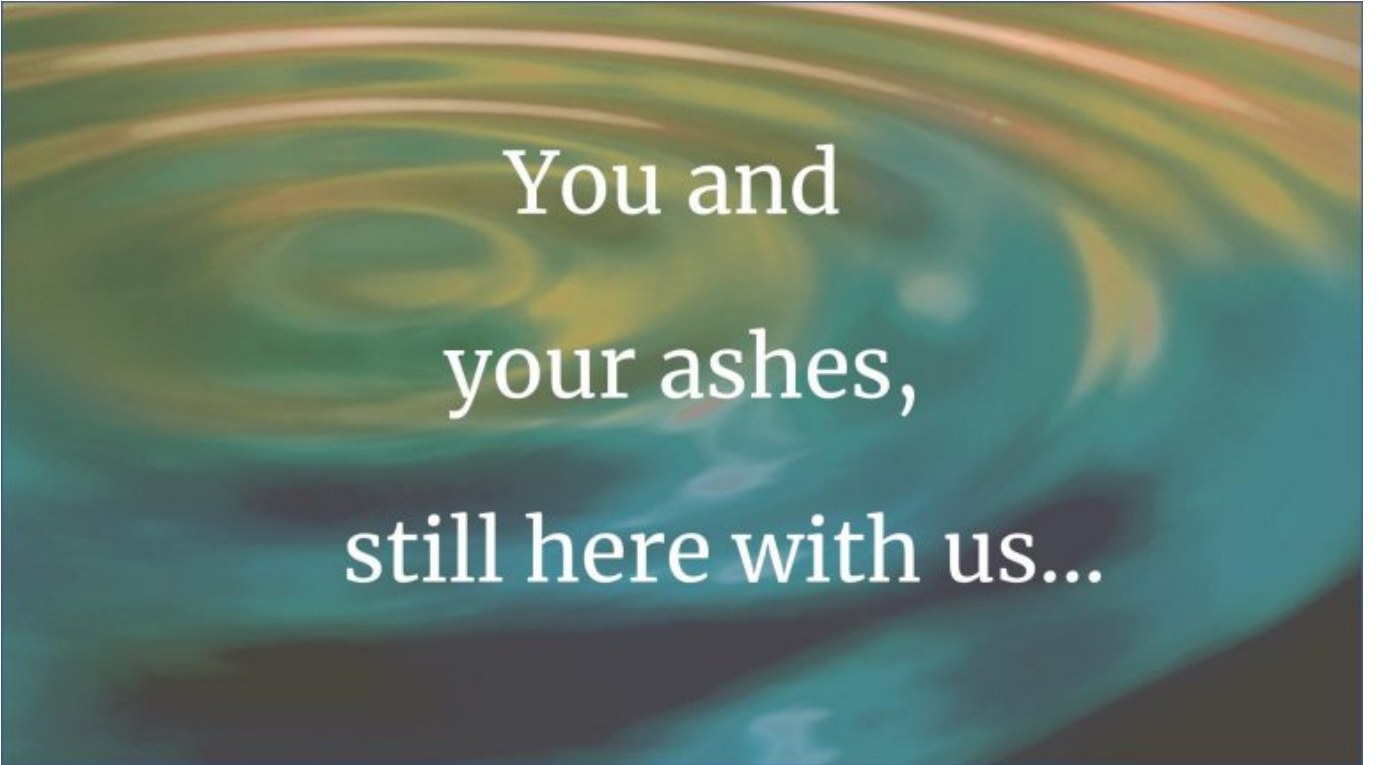


Earth to Earth
